The Weekend: Will consist of some classroom instruction on the BLS (Basic Life Support) on the Sat morning, then continual scenarios designed to cover all topics.

The overnights: Come prepared with “rough-up-able apparel” and to stay outdoors given the time of year. If conditions or camping ability warrants you can stay indoors.



Meals can be brought with you or you can scoot into Sackville only 5 minutes away. A small kitchen is available at the base. (Sorry, no showers though)

The minimum age to participate is 12 years of age - all individuals under 16 years of age must be accompanied by a registered adult .
